

FAQ's for Mentors

What is my role as a mentor?

You are a friend, role model, confidant, an encourager and nurturer of possibilities. Your role is to see the strengths of your mentee and help him flourish personally. You are not a mentor to the family, a social worker or doctor, or a savior.

Where will I mentor my student?

All interactions between you and your mentor will take place on an LISD campus during school hours or school sponsored event.

Will I keep my assigned student for more than one school year?

Maybe. Students are selected for the mentoring program for many different reasons. If your mentee reaches their goals with your help and no longer needs a mentor then the next year you may move to a different student. If you and your mentee are a good match and they still need you, then yes you may stay with the same student from year to year. We have even had mentors move with their student to a new school!
